Assessment:

1. Case Presentation (50%)

There will be 3 rounds of grouped case presentation. Students are assigned into 12 groups of 4-5 students in each group. Each group have to prepare a **20 minutes** case presentation, and there will be about **15-20 minutes of discussion** afterwards. There will be 3 case presentations in each seminar.

According to the latest announcement from the university about infection control, all classes are resumed back to <u>face-to-face mode</u>. However, in case, for students required to be quarantine for infection control, we might arrange real time online meeting by ZOOM for the presentation or for broadcasting.

Each student will present once in each round of the session. The case in Round 1 will be assigned, and each group are required to bid for the favor topic for Round 2 and Round 3. Rules will be announced.

2. Written Assignment (50%)

Detail: To prepare a case report of 1,000 – 2,000 words on ANY of the presented cases (not limited to owns presentation).

The case report should include not only the presented scope but should cover the whole case issues. Below are the suggested contents, and you might decide contents to make the report comprehensive:

- Introductions and Background - Case History

- Treatment Plan and Expected Outcome - The inspiration and other discussions.
