Brief Description:

Assessment and rehabilitation requirements for different body regions will be covered systemically, highlighting their special requirements. This would include rehabilitation for tendon and nerve injuries in the upper extremities, rehabilitation of ligament injuries in the lower limbs (especially related to sports injuries), and back rehabilitation. Special issues will cover rehabilitation for joint replacement, major and multiple fractures (e.g. pelvic fractures)

Students should be able to understand and apply:

1. Spinal problems: lower limbs arthritis, lower limb injuries, upper limb injuries and upper limb non-injury disorders
2. Nerve injury rehabilitation, major trauma, multiple trauma, overuse syndromes, ankylosing spondylitis and rheumatoid arthritis
3. Musculoskeletal infection, tumour surgery and osteoporotic fracture
4. Obstetrical and gynaecological related musculoskeletal problems
5. Burn management and plastic surgery
6. Musculoskeletal problems in growing children and elderly
